In other zones, you'll want to grow your dragon fruit in a container so you can bring it indoors for the winter. The ideal growing temperatures for dragon fruit are between 65 and 85 degrees Fahrenheit. Anything below 32F will kill your plant. Anything over 100F will damage the fruit and cause it to wilt.

Cut and Dried. Dragon fruit plants are usually started from cuttings rather than seeds, since cuttings flower more quickly. Select three or four sections of stem that are 6 to 15 inches long. When severing the sections from the mother plant, cut at a slight slant. Allow the cuttings to lie, uncovered, in a cool,...

Dragon fruit can be grown almost anywhere in the world. In very cold climates it needs to be protected or it may struggle as it grows best in a warm climate with mild winters. It can be rather drought proof and survive harsh dry conditions; however, the plant does seem to like regular water (in good draining soil)...

### **Dragon Fruit (Pitaya) - How-to Guide for Growing**

The complex flavor of the dragon fruit is often described using more common fruits like pears and strawberries. Cacti grown from the seeds inside dragon fruit take much longer to fruit and are less likely to survive. Properly taken cuttings sprout roots in no soil and are usually ready to plant within a week.

Dragon fruit grow easily from seed or cuttings. To grow from seed, squash some flesh onto paper towel and keep moist in a warm position but away from direct sunlight. Seeds will sprout 2-3 weeks later and can be potted up into punnets.

Dragon fruit, like most cacti, prefers plenty of warmth. If you garden in USDA Zones 10 or 11, you can grow it outdoors year round. In Zone 9, you should be able to grow it outdoors until the weather starts to cool, then bring it inside to the sunporch or greenhouse for the winter months.

The dragon fruit is a vining cactus that is native primarily to Mexico and other countries in Central and South America. The night-blooming flowers last only one night. Although dragon fruit is more likely to be propagated from cuttings, it is possible to grow it from seeds found in the edible fruit.
